Handouts: Degree name change to the M.A. in Applied Economics, revision to the Education Specialist in School Psychology, Graduate Certificate in Technology Commercialization, Graduate Certificate in Entrepreneurship, and courses and special topics.

- The meeting began at 12:40 p.m. in Room 243 MH. A quorum was established. Dr. Chuck Reilly chaired the meeting for Ram Mohapatra, who was not available for this meeting.
- Degree name change to the M.A. in Applied Economics.** Dr. Milon shared rationale for this name change and indicated that over the past 2 years, this program has been completely overhauled and upgraded as a result of the new Ph.D. program in Economics. There is nothing especially applied in the current master program, thus necessitating a name change. The MAAE degree name was also unfamiliar to many employers. The new degree name will be a Master of Science with the diploma name reading Master of Science in Economics. This change was approved by the committee for the 2006-2007 catalog year.
- Revisions to the Education Specialist in School Psychology.** Dr. Gordon Taub presented rationale for this change indicating that the Florida Department of Education procedures require that students graduating in this field complete a course in reading. They are requesting to officially add RED 5147 to the required courses which will eliminate the need to substitute a course which they have been previously doing to meet this requirement. This revision will change the program credit hours from 83 to 86 hours. The revision was approved by the committee.
- Graduate Certificates: 1) Technology Commercialization and 2) Entrepreneurship.** Dr. Cameron Ford gave a presentation on the rationale for offering these two graduate certificates in the Management Department, College of Business Administration. A question was raised from the committee regarding offering just 1 certificate as two of the 3 courses for the certificates were the same. Dr. Ford pointed out the two different audiences with one certificate providing specific technology commercialization education and the other providing more general entrepreneurship education. There was also a question raised if a student would be allowed to get both certificates. Dr. Ford indicated that this would not be possible. The Graduate Council has requested that the actual qualifying scores for the GMAT and GRE not be listed in the catalog copy. Instead, emphasize that high levels of standards are expected, with an outstanding GMAT, and a competitive score on the GRE. The committee further indicated that the program may indicate in their advertising, the current GMAT and GRE scores that are being accepted. It should also be noted in the catalog copy that students can obtain only 1 of the 2 certificates. These certificates were approved pending changes.
- Courses and special topics.** See attachment for courses that were approved. Courses that were tabled for further information included the following:
 - SDS 6XXX Internship in Professional School Counseling:** This CAR was tabled as the committee questioned why the department did not use the generic course number for internships that is specifically set up for internships. The course was tabled pending discussion with the department regarding this item.
 - SDS 6620 Coordination of Comprehensive Professional School Counseling Program:** This course was approved pending clarification on the wording for the description.
 - EME 6053 Current Trends in Instructional Technology.** This course was tabled pending additional information on what the actual revision was for this course.
- The meeting was adjourned at 1:30 p.m. The Graduate Council Curriculum Subcommittee will meet again on February 10.
