Welcome and call to order. Dr. Deborah Breiter, chair, welcomed the committee and guests. The minutes of the last meeting were reviewed and approved unanimously with no changes.

Revisions to the Social Science Education graduate certificate program. Dr. Scott Waring presented the revisions to this certificate. The request was that all courses be listed under the required courses with a statement of "choose 4 of the following courses." Two courses will be added to the list. There was a question raised about the large list of courses which was unusual for a certificate. Dr. Waring indicated that Social Science was such a broad program that the department was requesting the additional courses for this certificate. He also stated that these courses could be transferred into the master's program. This change received unanimous approval from the committee.

Revisions to the PhD in Hospitality Management. Dr. Alan Fyall gave an overview of the revisions to the program. The request was to delete PAF 7806 and add Theories in Hospitality and Tourism to the required courses. Also, the department requested to add a course option of HMG 6586 to the PAF 7802 course. These changes received unanimous approval from the committee.

Addition of an MSW Orlando P-T Advanced Standing track - COHPA. Dr. Shawn Lawrence gave a summary of the addition of this track. The track was being created to meet the needs of many of their current BSW students. Many of the students were working and a full-time track was impossible for them. The school recently discontinued their Daytona part-time track. This request received unanimous approval from the committee.

Bayesian Analysis and Approximation Theory: PR: One of the following combinations: (1) Either MAP 5210 or MAA 5228 and MAS 5145; (2) AST 4762C or AST 5765; or (3) C.I. Bayes' theorem, Fourier and wavelet transforms. Function approximation in multidimensional spaces. Kernels, Splines. Bayesian data analysis, Monte Carlo and Markov Chain Monte Carlo methods. *Occasional.*

Abbrev: (29 of 30 chars) Bayesian Analysis Approx. Th.

Discussion with others: The department of Statistics was consulted regarding this course and no objection to offering this course was made by that department. Email available upon request.

Rationale: Many problems in modern science are associated with analysis of large data sets that, one hopes, contains functional data (i.e., the data follow some underlying structure of interest). The data may be sampled in a multidimensional space, so their organization, visualization, and exploration become challenging, or there may be a weak signal amid strong systematic effects, making parameter estimation difficult. Problems associated with analysis of such data are at the frontiers of research in both mathematics (for example, in approximation theory) and statistics (functional data analysis, Bayesian methods, model selection techniques, Monte Carlo methods).
