1. Dr. Mohapatra began the meeting at 10:30 a.m. Dr. Holcomb introduced Donni Alvarenga, a graduate student in the Nursing program, who was attending as a guest. Paige Borden, Institutional Research; Peg Miller, Distributed Learning; Paul Cheney, Management Information Systems; and Richard Lapchick, DeVos Sport Business Management, also attended as guests.
2. **Announcement of subcommittee name change** – Dr. Bishop announced that this subcommittee will be getting a new name of Graduate Council Curriculum Subcommittee. This change was recently approved by the Faculty Senate.
3. **Revisions to the M.S. in Management Information Systems** – the MIS Department has requested to move a required course of MAN 6305 Human Resource Management to an elective. This will be replaced with a new required course, ISM 5XXX Information Systems Project Management. In addition, they requested that students no longer be required to take two business electives and two MIS electives. Instead, they proposed one business elective and three MIS electives, as these changes will make this a more marketable program. Two new courses were proposed as electives. No changes to the hours of this curriculum. These revisions were approved by the subcommittee.
4. **Revisions to the MFA Sport Business Management** – after reviewing the curriculum content, the department would like to change the sequencing of the internship program from the summer between year one and year two to the culminating experience following the completion of all coursework. This change will alleviate students from having to return to UCF the second year of coursework. The sport industry is not conducive to scheduling summer internship opportunities, and students will also be able to accept internships that are longer in duration. They are proposing to combine the Sport and Social Issues and the Diversity Management course into 1, 1.5 credit hour course, and then offering 2 new, 1.5 credit hour courses with students choosing one of these 2 courses. The overall credit hours for this program remains the same. These changes will be consistent for both the MBA and the Master in Sport Business Management. The subcommittee requested that the option of taking 1 of the 2 newly offered, 1.5 credit hour courses, be explained in the catalog copy. These changes were approved by the subcommittee.
5. **Name change to the MFA in Computer Art and Design** – the College of Arts and Sciences requests a name change to the MFA in Computer Art and Design. The new name request is Studio Art and the Computer. Dr. Bishop indicated that this new title would be consistent with the proposal and with other institutions. In addition, Dr. Bishop asked the committee if they would prefer that program name changes be brought before the subcommittee for approval. The subcommittee agreed that program name changes should be put on the subcommittee agenda. This change was approved by the subcommittee.
6. **Course and special topics** – see attached list for approval of courses and special topics.
7. **Materials and supplies fee requests** – all fees were approved. The subcommittee was reminded that the maximum amount allowed for materials and supplies fees is \$45.00. Fees approved as follows:
