Handouts: Changes to Film and Digital Media tracks, Inactivation of the M.S. in Management, Inactivation of the M.A. track in Physical Education, Addition of a graduate certificate in Global and Comparative Education, courses and special topics, and materials and supplies fee requests.

- The meeting began at 12:30 p.m. in Room 243 MH. A quorum was established. Dr. Ram Mohapatra chaired this meeting.
- Changes to Film and Digital Media tracks:** Dr. Clint Bowers presented the rationale for the changes to this program and requested that the previously approved MFA track in Visual and Interactive Language be activated to begin accepting applications for fall 2006. The changes also included that the MA track in Visual and Interactive Language be deactivated. In addition, the program requests that any active applicant for the fall 2006 semester in the MA track be transferred to the MFA track. Any student that is currently active in the MA track will be given the option of switching to the MFA track or remain in the MA track. These changes were approved by the Graduate Council.
- Inactivation of the M.S. in Management.** Dr. Foard Jones presented a summary for the inactivation of this degree. The rationale for the inactivation is due to low demand for the program and inability to adequately staff the program at this time. Plans are to not accept students in this program for the next 4 to 5 years. They would like to reopen the program in the future when demand and staffing issues are resolved. There was a question asked as to where interested students were being directed since this program will no longer be offered. The department is encouraging students to consider publication administration and other related programs. There are approximately 20+ students that need to take ½ the program yet. The department will offer a sequence of courses for the next two years to graduate these students. This inactivation was approved by the committee for the 2006-2007 catalog year.
- Inactivation of the Teaching Physical Education track within the M.A. in Physical Education.** Dr. Williams presented the rationale for the department and indicated that the Teaching Physical Education track was not a state approved program at this time. This information was learned during a recent DOE/NCATE review. There are currently three full-time and one part-time student enrolled in this program. All four students will be able to continue in this track, if they so desire. This inactivation was approved by the Graduate Council.
- Graduate Certificate in Global and Comparative Education.** Karen Biraimah presented an overview of this new certificate. This 15-semester hour certificate is intended for students who wish to work in international and cross-cultural settings, bilateral and multilateral organizations, and/or state and federal government departments. She pointed out that the four courses in this certificate could be used as a lead in to the MA or M.Ed. program in Curriculum and Instruction. Students could be accepted into this program from other global areas. Yes, but they would need to take the M.A. teacher certification. This certificate could also be a lead in to other programs such as political science and foreign languages. This certificate was approved by Graduate Council with no changes.
- Courses and special topics.** See attachment for courses that were approved. Courses that were tabled for further information included the following:
 - ESI 6938 Space Industry Capstone Experience II.** The committee requested to review program curriculum on this course. There was a question as to whether there were two capstone experiences, thus the II included in the title. The special topic and course were tabled pending clarification regarding this.
- Materials and Supplies Fee Requests.** All materials and supplies fees were approved at the requested amount. See attachment for approved fees.
- The meeting was adjourned at 1:45 p.m. The Graduate Council Curriculum Subcommittee will meet again on February 24.
