Welcome and call to order. The meeting was called to order at 12:00 p.m. by Joyce Nutta, chair. A quorum was established. The minutes of the March 18 meeting were approved with one correction regarding the distribution of the minutes to faculty and staff.

Courses. Dr. Hayes was present to provide clarification for the three Brevard courses that were tabled at the last meeting. These courses were approved. Burt Pryor provided an overview of the Communications course that was on the agenda. This course was approved also.

Revisions to the Engineering Management track, MS Industrial Engineering, CECS. Drs. Reilly, Elshennawy, and Kotnour were present to give an overview of the modification to the track. The proposed modification will include a professional Science master's option (PSM) for students who are seeking such a program which will be available as an elective to non thesis option students. A question was raised on whether there would be a problem with students meeting the 6000 course level requirement and Dr. Reilly pointed out that Dr. Elshennawy monitors this for each student. There was a question regarding the fee and if it had been approved. It was noted that the fee had already been approved. These track changes were approved.

Addition of an MS e-HSA track addition, COHPA. Drs. Liberman and Cortelyou-Ward were present to give an overview of this track addition. Dr. Liberman indicated that this program is a 24 month, full-time, distance learning course of study. There will be 20 students and they may accept up to 30 in this lock step program. The students are required to attend 15 days on campus on weekends. Presentations of the courses will be presented and they will debrief students. Discussion was held on how they train faculty. The Division of Continuing Education funding model will be used. They have also worked with Regional Campuses to develop a marketing plan. A question was raised on the distance learning element and their terms of delivery. Dr. Liberman pointed out that every course was offered online and also face to face. They were also asked to explain the overload compensation for faculty. The committee also asked that the department explain what the "e" meant in the title. This new track was approved. The committee requested that catalog copy be sent.

Curriculum revisions to the Children's Services certificate, COHPA. Estelli Ramos presented a summary on the revisions and indicated that they have restructured courses to accommodate the full and part-time plans of study. Dr. Ramos then explained the full-time and part-time student plans of study. These changes were approved.

Reactivation and move of MA F&DM Visual Language and Interactive Media track, CAH. José Manuez-Cuadrawas present to give a summary of these changes. The department is requesting to reactivate this track and move from the MA in F&DM to the MFA in Studio Art and the Computer. Changes will be coming in the future to merge to form a new school in this area. The reactivation and move of this track was approved.

Revisions to the MFA Creative Writing program, CAH. Jocelyn Bartkevicius presented an overview for this program. The department is proposing to add one course to the specialization area and add and delete courses in the unrestricted electives area. No questions were raised. These revisions were approved.

Revisions to the MA in TESOL, CAH. Gergana Vitonova presented the revisions. She provided a summary of the course additions and deletions. She shared that these changes will keep the program up to date. These revisions were approved. The committee requested one change to the catalog copy which was adding the EDF 6401 back in the research section. They asked for revised catalog copy to be sent to Graduate Studies.

Revisions to the M.S. in Molecular Biology and Microbiology, COM. Dr. Poole gave an overview of this change. The department is requesting to change the capstone course in the non thesis option from 5 to 3 credit hours. This change was approved.

Changes to tracks and certificates in MS Nursing program, CON. Judy Ruland was present to speak on the Nurse Educator track. They are dropping 2 courses and adding 3 courses. Students will be notified of these new courses and they can take the courses and change catalog years if they want. Diane Wink gave a summary of the rest of the track revisions and inactivations. All track revisions and inactivations were approved by the committee.
